2nd annual Success@Lafayette summer course underway

<u>Success@Lafayette</u> is a free online, five-week, non-credit course focusing on academic and non-academic skills and concepts that are key to college success. Summer 2020 marks the second year that this program is being offered to incoming students. 47 students have registered for this summer's program.

A series of eight modules will provide students with a personalized study plan. The modules are focused on areas such as Motivating Success, Study Skills, Learning Styles and Strategies, Goal Setting and Time Management, Thinking and Analysis, Social Interaction and Diversity, Health Management, and Beyond the Classroom. The study plans are designed to engage students with the weekly material, as well as provide an interactive learning environment. In return, students receive individual feedback, perform formative self-checks, and participate in

assignments. Each module contains written text, video clips, and links to related learning materials.

In addition, participants are divided up into small groups that have weekly meetings via Google Meet. These sessions are led by teaching assistants (juniors and seniors) and serve as a way to review the material, provide a forum where questions can be answered, meet other incoming students, and talk about the transition to Lafayette and college in general.



Inaugural Sophomore Summer Institute in the books

The Office of Advising, working closely with the Gateway Career Center, Office of the Provost, and a number of awesome faculty and staff, has wrapped up the inaugural <u>Sophomore</u> <u>Summer Institute</u> (SSI). SSI was built as a free 6-week program that blended asynchronous and synchronous elements highlighting the transition from the 1st year to the 2nd year at Lafayette and college in general. Components focused on academic, career, social, and personal topics and milestones for rising sophomores to engage with as they make the most of their Lafayette experience. 89 students registered for this new program.



Prestigious awards given to Lafayette Forensics students!

The Lafayette Forensics Team has some very special news we would like to share. Graduating senior, Saeed Malami was named by the National Forensics Association as the "Performer of Highest Distinction" within the organization. NFA only gave this title to one student for 2020.

Typically the National Forensic Association hosts our final capstone competition.

Unfortunately due to Covid, the tournament had to shift online. NFA asked seniors and first-year competitors to submit performances for review. Five person committees of coaches and professors reviewed and ranked the submissions. The top performances in each event were given the title of "Performance of Distinction." A singular "Performance of Highest Distinction" was awarded to the highest ranked competitor in each event. Scores were also aggregated to designate the best performer across all of the events. Saeed was ranked as the best overall performer for the organization. Lafayette had several other awards. The students really finished off the year with style. Here are all of the results:


