

Important upcoming on-campus deadline!

There are some important upcoming scholarship/fellowship application deadlines for the Class 2021 and recent graduates. These include our campus application deadline of **August 28th** (for student draft materials) for those that require Lafayette nomination/endorsement: Marshall, Rhodes (US and Canadian applicants), Mitchell, Knight Hennessy (for Stanford), Fulbright, Schwarzman (for China).

There are others that are due early in the fall semester, including NSF-GRFP, Rangel, Payne, Pickering, Gates Cambridge, etc. Faculty are invited to review this <u>sample listing of postgraduate opportunities</u>. It is very helpful when faculty encourage their students and recent graduates to reach out to <u>Dean Julia Goldberg</u> before the campus deadline. This is also a period of time when faculty may be asked to write letters of recommendation for applicants.

Finally, the Fellowships and Scholarships Office continually seeks names of any students who stand out to faculty for their academic potential, intellectual curiosity, drive, and vision, with less emphasis on grades earned and more on the "spark" they conveyed. Conversation PARDner Program

The Conversation PARDner Program (CPP) is a peer program that promotes intercultural communications between international and domestic students through virtual conversations on Zoom. During summer, the CPP paired upper-level domestic students with incoming international students. Each pair scheduled conversations via Zoom, 1 hour per week, for 6 weeks. Participants were encouraged to practice language-learning activities provided by the English for Academic Purpose Center and reinforce topics included in the bi-weekly summer enewsletter sent to all incoming international students through the Office of International Student Advising.

During this Fall semester, the CPs will lead several group chat sessions through Zoom. Please invite both your international students and domestic students to join these discussions to practice their spoken language skills and develop their intercultural competence.
