Training "To Go": Effective Academic Advising Strategies

Each month, we will plan to share another training resource for academic advisors. If you have time during a lunch hour or other break in your day, these resources can help all our faculty hone their holistic academic advising skills. December's selection is a training from NACADA on [Effective Academic Advising Strategies](#). **Description:**

The CAS Standards for Academic Advising tell us that "the primary purpose of the Academic Advising Program is to assist students in the development of meaningful educational plans." The NACADA Statement of Core Values tells us that "academic advisors work to strengthen the importance, dignity, potential, and unique nature of each individual within the academic setting." Again and again, we hear advisors ask, "Exactly how do I go about doing that? What are some specific strategies I can use?" This presentation was designed with these questions in mind. If you have ever asked, "What works in academic advising?" you'll want to add this slidecast presentation to your advising library. NACADA Publications Advisory Board Chair Maura Reynolds begins the conversation with a review of six important general principles for improving learning. Then, moderated by NACADA President Jayne Drake, our Panel discusses six strategic approaches to advising that they have found beneficial in their advising practice: Self-Authorship, Motivational Interviewing, Intrusive, Strength-Based, Coaching, and Appreciative.

2021-2022 will mark Posse's 20th anniversary at Lafayette! Our ties with this incredible organization run deep.



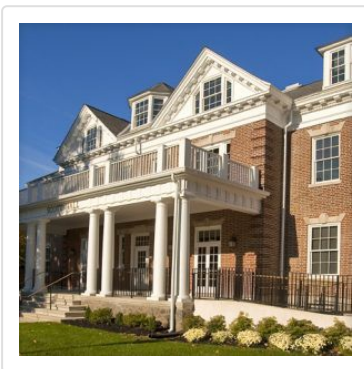
