Recruitment And Certification for Peer Tutors, SI and Mentored Study Group Leaders

Hub recruitment is underway for Peer Tutors, SI and Mentored Study Group Leaders for fall 2021. We welcome faculty input to build a student support team strong in content knowledge and good communication skills. Our primary focus is 100 and 200 level courses. Please consider students that you have taught or are currently teaching with these qualifications and encourage them to apply using the link <u>"How to Become a Tutor"</u>.

The application gives candidates the opportunity to be considered for all of our support positions by selecting the tutoring formats they prefer. Applicants request faculty recommendation within the application giving you have the opportunity to give us your assessment of the student's ability to serve in a peer support role. Applications are processed and positions are filled throughout the months of May, June, and July. New hires will be required to attend our CRLA tutor training in August. And we are happy to announce that Deniz Ozbay, Marwa Saleh, and Sena Yevenyo were recently awarded <u>CRLA Peer</u> <u>Tutor Level I</u> certification through The Hub. They join the 32% of our current roster previously certified.
