Amanda Pisetzner'ro is an Emmy Award-winning producer, Emmy-nominated writer, and documentary storyteller. She has worked on series and specials for Showtime, HBO, NBC, Discovery Channel, and more. Her work spans from character-driven profiles to complex historical documentaries.

Pisetzner is a storyteller at heart, driven by a desire to bridge communities and cultivate empathy in an increasingly divided world. By centering characters' stories and creating safe spaces for authentic interviews, she embraces documentary filmmaking's power to foster understanding, offer fresh perspectives, and inspire action.

Before working in film and television, Pisetzner studied the lived experiences of incarcerated and low-income women in California and Pennsylvania. She was awarded a Kathryn Wasserman Davis Project for Peace Grant and named a 2014 New Leaders Council Fellow, and has served as an associate board member for Lafayette College.

In 2024, Pisetzner became an end-of-life doula, gaining insight into the full spectrum of human experience. She teaches storytelling workshops for students and those nearing the end of life.

As an English and equality and social justice dual major at Lafayette, Pisetzner was awarded a Fulbright Award and the Gilbert Prize in English. She was a finalist for the Pepper Prize and Harry S. Truman Scholarship.
